2. About the roles

From 17 May to 9 August, we are offering a number of freelance **Creative Team Associate** roles in the following areas:

- Lighting (lead creatives: Ciaran Bagnall and/or Aideen Malone)
- Sound (lead creatives: Giles Thomas and/or Nick Lidster)
- Movement (lead creative: Ingrid MackInnon)
- Voice (lead creative: Barbara Houseman)

Collaborating on our productions of *Romeo and Juliet* and/or *Carousel*, you will broaden your experience of making large-scale work. Joining the team at the start of rehearsals, you will assist, work closely with and be mentored by the lead creatives in your discipline and be supported by permanent Creative Associate, Nic Wass. You will attend some rehearsals, production meetings, technical rehearsals, previews and the press performance for each production. It is likely you will need to commit around two days a week during rehearsals and be present as much as possible throughout the tech and preview period¹. You will be a credited member of the creative team.

3. What skills are needed?

Successful applicants will have:

- a minimum of three professional credits (at any type or scale of venue) in your chosen discipline;
- a passion and ambition to continue and develop your theatrical creative career;
- a sympathetic approach to creative concepts;

- an ability to realise, support and contribute to the vision of the lead creatives;
- excellent attention to detail; and
- a calm, organised, tactful, collaborative team player approach.
