# ABOUT US

**Established in 1932, the multi-award-winning Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is one of the largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,304). Passionate about producing popular, enriching and unexpected theatre that provides a lens into the here and now, the scale and ambition of our productions together with our magical outdoor setting, makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. In 2025 we welcomed just under 177,000 people to our 20-week summer season.**

**Drew McOnie assumed the role of Artistic Director in January 2024, and James Pidgeon was appointed Executive Director in 2021.**

Over the last sixteen years, our productions have won ten Olivier Awards, ten WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* has just finished tours of the UK, North America and Australia. Our Olivier Award-winning revival of *Fiddler on the Roof* transferred to the Barbican Centre in May 2025 ahead of a major tour of UK and Ireland through to January 2026.

As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, we rely entirely on earned income and charitable contributions. Nevertheless, we have maintained 36,000 tickets at £15 across the whole of 2025's summer season, our BREEZE scheme enables those aged 18-25 to buy tickets for £10, and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils.

Food and drink plays a significant role in the Open Air Theatre experience, with our in-house bars and restaurants including Covered Dining, The Grill and The Pizza Oven. We also have our own picnic lawn and the West End's longest bar!

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we're proud to embark on the next stage of our vision with ever-increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.

# JOB ROLE

## KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is seeking a practical, adaptable and enthusiastic Duty Technician to support the delivery of Anansi the Spider on the Picnic Lawn during the 2026 season.

Following the success of the production's previous run at Regent's Park Open Air Theatre in 2021, alongside sold-out runs at the Unicorn Theatre in 2023 and 2025, this production forms part of the theatre's continued programme of outdoor work for young audiences, following productions including Every Leaf a Hallelujah.

Working closely with the visiting company and Regent's Park production teams, the Duty Technician will oversee the day-to-day technical and audience set-up for performances, supporting the safe and smooth delivery of the production in a unique outdoor environment.

The primary function of the role is to manage the daily set-up, changeover and technical operation of the production each day. The majority of hours for this contract are daytime hours, typically between 8.30am and 4.30pm, Monday to Sunday with Thursdays off, though flexibility will occasionally be required depending on weather and operational needs.

This is a hands-on, generalist technical role suited to someone confident working independently, problem-solving practically, and supporting live performance in changing outdoor conditions.

This role involves:

### Production and Audience Set-Up

- Lead the day-to-day set-up and pack-down of the production in collaboration with the visiting company.
- Support the installation and safe positioning of scenic elements, staging and technical equipment each day.
- Prepare the audience area for performances, including moving picnic benches, laying audience mats and ensuring the space is safe, clean and welcoming.
- Assist the visiting Stage Management and technical teams with daily set-up, performance preparation and strike procedures.

## **Lighting and Sound Support**

- Set up, check and maintain the production's basic lighting and sound systems each day.
- Operate lighting systems as required, including powering systems on and off and carrying out simple fault-finding where necessary.
- Set up and test radio microphones and playback equipment prior to performances.
- Rig check the sound system and troubleshoot any issues that arise before performances.
- Complete basic maintenance or emergency repairs, escalating issues to the Heads of Department where additional support may be required.

## **Outdoor Operations and Wet Weather Procedures**

- Support the implementation of wet weather procedures and contingency plans in line with venue policies.
- Assist with drying and preparing performance and audience areas during adverse weather conditions to ensure safe operation where performances continue.
- Maintain stage and backstage areas to ensure they remain safe, tidy and operational at all times.

- Demonstrate awareness of the additional operational and safety considerations involved in outdoor performance work.

## **Collaboration and Working Practices**

- Act as a key day-to-day technical contact between the visiting company and Regent's Park production teams.
- Work collaboratively with Front of House, Production and Stage Management teams to support the smooth running of performances.
- Create and encourage a supportive, welcoming and professional environment for audiences, artists and colleagues.
- Maintain a proactive and flexible approach to supporting the wider team and assisting other departments where required.

**The ideal candidate will be a practical and reliable technician with experience supporting live events, theatre or outdoor performance activity. They will be comfortable working independently, adaptable in changing weather conditions, and confident supporting basic lighting and sound systems within a live performance environment.**

- Previous experience working backstage in professional technical theatre, live events or a comparable performance environment.
- Basic practical understanding of lighting and sound systems.

- Ability to undertake practical manual tasks safely, including moving benches, mats and scenic equipment.
