ABOUT US

Established in 1932, the multi-award-winning Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is one of the largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,304). Passionate about producing popular, enriching and unexpected theatre that provides a lens into the here and now, the scale and ambition of our productions together with our magical outdoor setting, makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. In 2025 we welcomed just under 177,000 people to our 20-week summer season.

Drew McOnie assumed the role of Artistic Director in January 2024, and James Pidgeon was appointed Executive Director in 2021.

Over the last sixteen years, our productions have won ten Olivier Awards, ten WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* has just finished tours of the UK, North America and Australia. Our Olivier Award-winning revival of *Fiddler on the Roof* transferred to the Barbican Centre in May 2025 ahead of a major tour of UK and Ireland through to January 2026.

As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, we rely entirely on earned income and charitable contributions. Nevertheless, we have maintained 36,000 tickets at £15 across the whole of 2025's summer season, our BREEZE scheme enables those aged 18-25 to buy tickets for £10, and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils.

Food and drink plays a significant role in the Open Air Theatre experience, with our in-house bars and restaurants including Covered Dining, The Grill and The Pizza Oven. We also have our own picnic lawn and the West End's longest bar!

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we're proud to embark on the next stage of our vision with ever-increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.

JOB ROLE

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is looking to build its database of Freelance Lighting Technicians to support production periods across our busy and varied 2026 season.

This is a general call-out for technicians interested in being considered for freelance work across our programme, rather than recruitment for a specific contract or role. Engagements may vary in length and responsibility depending on the production, and may include fit-ups, technical rehearsals, maintenance calls, performances, changeovers, concerts and one-off events.

We are keen to hear from technicians with a range of experience and backgrounds who are interested in working in our unique outdoor theatre environment.

Freelance Lighting Technicians engaged through this call-out may be asked to:

- Assist with installing lighting rigs, focusing and lighting shows as directed by the Lighting Designer to meet the artistic and technical requirements of each production.
- Conduct daily rig checks and system tests to maintain lighting systems, fault-find and carry out repairs or equipment swaps as required.
- Make practical electrics units for individual productions where required.



- Move temporary stage lighting, refocus lanterns and set practicals during changeover days.
- Support PAT testing and the regular maintenance of lighting equipment.
- Work with the Head of Lighting to ensure licensing requirements relating to production lighting and stage power are met and maintained.
- Undertake other reasonable duties as required by the Head of Lighting or senior management.
- Work collaboratively with other departments and contribute to a safe, professional and supportive working environment.

The precise duties, hours and level of responsibility will vary depending on the nature of each engagement.



PERSON SPECIFICATION

We welcome CVs from Lighting Technicians at all stages of their career, from early-career practitioners building professional credits through to highly experienced freelancers. Experience may come from theatre, touring, festivals, live events or related technical environments.

Essential

- Previous experience working as a Lighting Technician or in a comparable role within a professional theatre, live events environment, production company or tour.
- Demonstrable ability to carry out the responsibilities outlined above, including an understanding of the specific hazards associated with working outdoors.
- Knowledge of ETC Eos lighting control systems.
- Experience of working at height, including harness work on vertical truss towers (additional training can be provided where required).
- Awareness of health and safety legislation and safe working practices.
- A calm, organised and practical approach to work.
- Excellent interpersonal skills and a collaborative approach to working within technical teams.
- Ability to be creative and resourceful in problem solving.
- An understanding and commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion.
- A passion for Regent's Park Open Air Theatre and the work we produce

If there are some skills in the Essential criteria that you do not currently have but feel you could learn and develop over time, please still apply and note this in your application.

The role might require work in the evenings, on the weekends and/or Bank Holidays.
