About Us

Established in 1932, the multi-award-winning Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is one of the largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,256). Passionate about producing first class theatre for and in our unique setting which inspires, challenges and entertains, the scale and ambition of our outdoor productions makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. Every year we welcome over 140,000 people to our 20-week summer season.

Over the last twelve years, our productions have won seven Olivier Awards, seven WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK, and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* recently started its second tour of North America and will be touring the UK from September 2023. As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, over 90% of our income is currently generated from ticket sales. Nevertheless, we have maintained our lowest ticket price of £25 for nine years, our BREEZE scheme enables those aged 18-25 to buy tickets for £10, and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils. In the past year, the number of Annual Members has increased by 31% and our Patron Scheme by 10%.

Our in-house bars and restaurants champion exemplary customer service and offer a selection of dining choices, including our waiter-serviced Covered Dining (recently certified as a Sustainably Run Restaurant), afternoon tea, and more casual options such as picnics, The Grill and The Pizza Oven.

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we embark on the next stage of our vision with ever-increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.



Head of Partnerships & Philanthropy

We are looking for a committed, innovative and experienced fundraiser to fulfil the role of Head of Partnerships & Philanthropy, responsible for developing and driving the strategic delivery of Regent's Park Open Air Theatre's fundraising output and ambition across corporate partnerships, individual giving, memberships, and trusts and foundations. This is a key Head of Department role in the theatre's permanent staff team.

The role involves:

- Achieving annual contributed income targets (as set with the Executive Director; currently in the region of £500k), leading on the development and delivery of short and medium-term strategic plans and campaigns to reach, and where possible exceed, such targets.
- Working alongside the Executive Director to shape longer-term (3 years +) fundraising strategies for the theatre, developing a compelling case for support.
- Ensuring a strategic and innovative approach to the cultivation, development and relationship management of both new and existing partnerships across corporates, individuals, trusts and foundations, and any other partnership opportunities that align with the organisation's values.
- Leading on major donor giving across all sectors of fundraised income.
- Leading on the delivery of fundraising applications, pitches and proposals alongside the subsequent administrative delivery of contracting, budgeting, evaluation and monitoring.

- Designing and delivering an effective annual programme of both partnership events for existing supporters alongside cultivation and stewardship events for new prospects.
- Acting as a key contact for all partnership and philanthropy relationships, ensuring that benefits, events, and other reasonable requests are delivered to the highest possible standard, collaborating as necessary with colleagues across the organisation in order to achieve this.
- Working closely with the Director of Communications & Audiences and Marketing Manager to develop high-quality marketing assets, literature and campaigns to attract new donors and sponsors as well as heighten the profile of the theatre's fundraising activity.
- Playing a key role in the planning and delivery of season-related events such as press nights, Trustee receptions, and stakeholder entertaining, including the development of partnerships to sponsor and/or supply product for such activity.
- Working closely with the Executive Director and Director of Communications & Audiences on corporate opportunities and brand alignment with individuals and other organisations.
- Effectively managing all departmental budgets and finances in line with the organisation's financial systems and procedures.
- Maintaining and safeguarding all documentation, records, filing systems and databases as required to ensure compliance with internal policies, data protection, financial and other regulations including Gift Aid and VAT.

- Working with colleagues to consistently improve the experience of our fundraising and philanthropic partners online, on the phone, and onsite.
- As a Head of Department, contributing to the implementation and evolution of the organisation's strategic priorities as set out in our 2022-27 Strategy.
- Any other duties as reasonably requested by the Executive or Artistic Directors.

- A proven track record of creating and delivering innovative fundraising campaigns and strategies that meet if not exceed agreed targets.
- Demonstrable experience of successfully cultivating, nurturing and managing partner relationships across corporates, individuals, members and/or trusts and foundations.
- Experience of developing and delivering cultivation and fundraising events.
- Experience of raising and stewarding gifts of £10k and above.
- Excellent organisational skills, with an intrinsic eye for detail and the ability to work effectively under pressure and meet deadlines.
- Advanced skills in both written and oral communication and presentation.
- The ability to inspire, motivate and persuade; to proactively develop successful relationships built on collaboration and trust.
- Strong and confident negotiator who is goals-

orientated and targets-driven.
