ABOUT US

Established in 1932, the multi-award-winning Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is one of the largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,304). Passionate about producing popular, enriching and unexpected theatre that provides a lens into the here and now, the scale and ambition of our productions together with our magical outdoor setting, makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. In 2025 we welcomed just under 177,000 people to our 20-week summer season.

Drew McOnie assumed the role of Artistic Director in January 2024, and James Pidgeon was appointed Executive Director in 2021.

Over the last sixteen years, our productions have won ten Olivier Awards, ten WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* has just finished tours of the UK, North America and Australia. Our Olivier Award-winning revival of *Fiddler on the Roof* transferred to the Barbican Centre in May 2025 ahead of a major tour of UK and Ireland through to January 2026.

As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, we rely entirely on earned income and charitable contributions. Nevertheless, we have maintained 36,000 tickets at £15 across the whole of 2025's summer season, our BREEZE scheme enables those aged 18-25 to buy tickets for £10, and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils.

Food and drink plays a significant role in the Open Air Theatre experience, with our in-house bars and restaurants including Covered Dining, The Grill and The Pizza Oven. We also have our own picnic lawn and the West End's longest bar!

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we're proud to embark on the next stage of our vision with ever-increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.

JOB ROLE

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is seeking an experienced and proactive Senior Lighting Technician to join the Lighting Department for the 2026 season. Working closely with the Head of Lighting and freelance lighting staff, the Senior Lighting Technician will lead the day-to-day operation and maintenance of the lighting systems across the season, supporting the delivery of a diverse programme of productions in our unique outdoor environment.

This role plays a key part in ensuring the consistent artistic quality, safety and reliability of lighting throughout rehearsals, technical periods and performances, while contributing to a collaborative and professional backstage culture.

This role involves:

Department delivery and technical operation

- Support the Head of Lighting and freelance lighting technicians in the installation, focusing and programming of lighting rigs to meet the creative requirements of each production.
- Operate the lighting control system for all performances, maintaining the artistic integrity of each show following the Lighting Designer's departure and post-press night or technical freeze.
- Carry out daily rig checks and system tests, proactively fault-finding and repairing or replacing equipment as required to ensure safe and reliable operation.



- Make, adapt and maintain practical electrics units as required for individual productions.
- Move, re-focus and re-set temporary lighting and practicals on changeover days, working efficiently to support tight turnaround schedules.

Supervision, maintenance and compliance

- In conjunction with the Head of Lighting, supervise follow-spot operators and other temporary lighting staff as required.
- Undertake PAT testing and routine maintenance of lighting equipment, ensuring accurate records are maintained.
- Support the Head of Lighting in ensuring compliance with licensing requirements relating to production lighting and stage power.
- Work in accordance with all health and safety procedures, including safe systems of work for outdoor environments and working at height.

Collaboration and professional practice

- Work closely with Stage Management, other technical departments and the wider production team to support smooth rehearsals and performances.
- Assist with get-ins, get-outs and changeovers, including weekend work as required.
- Support Regent's Park's commitment to accessibility, including assisted and access-focused performances.
- Act in line with policies on safeguarding, sustainability, equal opportunities and professional conduct.
- Carry out any other duties normally associated with the role of Senior Lighting Technician on a first-class theatrical production.



PERSON SPECIFICATION

The ideal candidate will be a highly skilled and dependable lighting technician with strong operational experience, a practical and methodical approach to problem-solving, and the ability to work calmly under pressure in a live performance environment. They will be collaborative, safety-conscious and committed to maintaining high artistic and technical standards.

Essential

- Previous experience working as a Senior Lighting Technician or in a comparable role on a professional theatre production, tour or within a similar-sized venue.
- Proven ability to carry out all duties listed above, including an understanding of the specific hazards associated with working outdoors.
- Strong working knowledge of ETC Eos lighting control systems.
- Good understanding of lighting networks and data distribution.
- Experience conducting rig checks, fault-finding and equipment maintenance.
- Calm, organised and tactful approach, with the ability to prioritise workload effectively.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, with a collaborative approach to working.
- Creative and resourceful problem-solving skills.
- Sound knowledge of health and safety legislation and best practice.
- Experience of working at height, including harness work on vertical truss towers (training will be provided where required).



- Ability to work independently and take responsibility for day-to-day departmental operation when required.
- An understanding and commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion.
- A passion for Regent's Park Open Air Theatre and the work we produce
