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ABOUT US

Established in 1932, the multi-award-winning Regent's Park Open Air Theatre is one of the largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,304). Passionate about producing popular, enriching and unexpected theatre that provides a lens into the here and now, the scale and ambition of our productions together with our magical outdoor setting, makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. In 2025 we welcomed just under 177,000 people to our 20-week summer season.

Drew McOnie assumed the role of Artistic Director in January 2024, and James Pidgeon was appointed Executive Director in 2021.

Over the last sixteen years, our productions have won ten Olivier Awards, ten WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* has just finished tours of the UK, North America and Australia. Our Olivier Award-winning revival of *Fiddler on the Roof* transferred to the Barbican Centre in May 2025 ahead of a major tour of UK and Ireland through to January 2026.

As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, we rely entirely on earned income and charitable contributions. Nevertheless, we have maintained 36,000 tickets at £15 across the whole of 2025's summer season, our BREEZE scheme enables those aged 18-25 to buy tickets for £10, and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils.

Food and drink plays a significant role in the Open Air Theatre experience, with our in-house bars and restaurants including Covered Dining, The Grill and The Pizza Oven. We also have our own picnic lawn and the West End's longest bar!

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we're proud to embark on the next stage of our vision with ever-increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.

JOB ROLE

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

We are seeking a skilled and committed Sound No. 3 to join the Sound Department for the 2026 season, working across all productions in the programme.

Working closely with the Sound No. 1 and Sound No. 2, and alongside Stage Management and the wider production team, this role is central to the smooth technical delivery of sound for rehearsals, technical periods and performances. The Sound No. 3 will support the operation and maintenance of sound systems, assist with radio microphone preparation and on-stage plotting, and contribute to a positive and professional backstage environment.

In addition, the role includes limited technical swing responsibilities, supporting the lighting department with pre-show rig checks and fault-finding where required.

This role involves:

Department support and delivery

- Support the Head of Sound, Production Sound Engineers, Sound No. 1 and Sound No. 2 in the preparation, setup and management of sound equipment and venue supplies during technical rehearsals and throughout the run.
- Assist with sound maintenance following the fit-up, carrying out routine checks and reporting issues promptly.
- Work closely with the Sound No. 1 and Sound No. 2 to ensure consistency and continuity across performances.
- Act up as Sound No. 2 on performances as required.
- Radio microphones and performance support
- Assist with the preparation, testing, fitting and maintenance of radio microphones as scheduled.
- Support on-stage sound plotting during performances, following established show tracks.
- Assist with sound checks and contribute to the smooth technical running of performances.
- Respond promptly to sound-related issues during performances, escalating where appropriate.

Rehearsals and production logistics

- Provide technical sound support for cast rehearsals as required by the Company Stage Manager.
- Attend technical and dress rehearsals to ensure a clear understanding of sound requirements and any resulting changes.
- Actively support get-ins and get-outs, including Saturday night get-outs, working collaboratively with other departments.
- Be an active and supportive member of the production team, assisting colleagues across departments where required.

Technical swing support (lighting)

- Where required, support the lighting department with pre-show rig checks, fault-finding and the replacement of equipment under the guidance of the lighting team.
- Carry out these duties in line with agreed procedures and only within the scope of training provided.

Standards, conduct and professional practice

- Assist in maintaining the high artistic and technical standards required by the Sound Designer.

- Create and encourage a positive, supportive and professional backstage environment for cast and crew.
- Support Regent's Park's commitment to making its productions accessible to all, including assisted performances.
- Act in line with Regent's Park Open Air Theatre policies on safeguarding, sustainability, equal opportunities, and professional conduct.
- Promote equity, diversity and inclusion, contributing to a working environment in which all staff feel supported and empowered.
- Carry out any other duties normally associated with the role of Sound No. 3 on a first-class play or musical production.

Our production of *CATS* which closes our 2026 season at the park will go immediately out on tour following the initial run. We would be interested in hearing through your application if you would be at all interested in a role on that tour beyond this contract.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

The ideal candidate will be an enthusiastic and technically capable early-career sound practitioner with a strong interest in professional theatre production. They will be reliable, well organised and calm under pressure, with a collaborative approach to working and a willingness to support both the Sound Department and the wider technical team.
