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




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ABOUT US

Established in 1932, the multiaward-winning Regent's Park **Open Air Theatre is one of the** largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,304). **Passionate about producing** popular, enriching and unexpected theatre that provides a lens into the here and now, the scale and ambition of our productions together with our magical outdoor setting makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. In 2024 we welcomed over 180,000 people to our 27-week summer season.

Over the last fifteen years, our productions have won seven Olivier Awards, ten WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK, and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* has just finished tours of both the UK and North America, and has recently commenced a tour of Australia. Our 2024 revival of *Fiddler on the Roof* will transfer to London's Barbican Theatre this summer, followed by a UK and Ireland tour.

As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, we rely entirely on earned income and charitable contributions. Nevertheless, we introduced 33,000 tickets at £15 across the whole of 2024's summer season and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils.

Food and drink plays a significant role in the Open Air Theatre experience, with our inhouse bars and restaurants including Covered Dining (recently certified as a Sustainably Run Restaurant), The Grill and The Pizza Oven. We also have our own picnic lawn and the West End's longest bar!

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we're proud to embark on the next stage of our vision with ever increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.

JOB ROLE Key Responsibilities

We are looking to recruit two Stage Technicians (Crew) for our 2025 season, to assist the day to day running of the Stage department for our busy and varied season of shows at Regent's Park Open Air Theatre.

The primary function of the Stage Technicians are to run the daily repertory changeovers of the set and stage elements between our day time family show performances and evening musical performances. The majority of hours for this contract are daytime (between 08.30am and 4.30pm), Monday to Sunday with Thursdays off.

- To change over the set and other stage elements each day between the day time family show and the evening musical performances.
- To assist the Head and Deputy Head of Stage with any other stage department duties, as required.
- To complete any basic set maintenance or emergency repairs as required, advising the Stage Team if any repairs require additional support before the following performance.
- To learn any crew plot including stage cues, as required and perform this plot for performances, as required.
- When required, appearing on stage in appropriate clothes or costume in order to carry out specific scene changes and cues.



- Running any daily checks of stage equipment, as necessary.
- To maintain the stage and backstage areas, keeping them safe, clean and tidy at all times.
- To assist the Lighting, Sound and Music teams with installing or moving any equipment during build, changeovers and strikes as required.
- To undertake any other reasonable duties as required by the Technical Heads of Department or senior management.



PERSON SPECIFICATION

- Previous experience working backstage in professional technical theatre, preferably within a similar-sized venue or production company or tour.
- Demonstrable ability to perform the duties listed above including proven understanding of the specific hazards involved in working outdoors.
- Basic carpentry skills and use of tools.
- Calm, organised and tactful approach.
- Excellent interpersonal skills with a collaborative approach to working.
- Ability to be creative and resourceful in problem solving.
- Awareness and experience of health and safety legislation.
- Experience of and comfort with working at height.
- A passion for Regent's Park Open Air Theatre and the work we produce.
- An understanding and commitment to diversity, inclusion and access.
