



# ABOUT US

Established in 1932, the multiaward-winning Regent's Park **Open Air Theatre is one of the** largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,304). Passionate about producing popular, enriching and unexpected theatre that provides a lens into the here and now, the scale and ambition of our productions together with our magical outdoor setting, makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. In 2024 we welcomed over 180,000 people to our 27-week summer season.

Drew McOnie assumed the role of Artistic Director in January 2024, and James Pidgeon was appointed Executive Director in 2021.


Over the last sixteen years, our productions have won ten Olivier Awards, ten WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* has just finished tours of the UK, North America and Australia. Our Olivier Award-winning revival of *Fiddler on the Roof* transferred to the Barbican Centre in May 2025 ahead of a major tour of UK and Ireland through to January 2026.

As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, we rely entirely on earned income and charitable contributions. Nevertheless, we have maintained 36,000 tickets at £15 across the whole of 2025's summer season, our BREEZE scheme enables those aged 18-25 to buy tickets for £10, and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils.

Food and drink plays a significant role in the Open Air Theatre experience, with our in-house bars and restaurants including Covered Dining, The Grill and The Pizza Oven. We also have our own picnic lawn and the West End's longest bar!

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we're proud to embark on the next stage of our vision with ever-increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.

### TREEHOUSE PROJECT

Treehouse Project is a new initiative in which Regent's Park Open Air Theatre will provide spaces for creatives to work, meet and dream. The project is designed to give five early-career theatre creatives space to develop their craft and shape their practice.

### The five successful applicants will be given:

- Desk space of their own to work, hold meetings and think creatively in throughout November 2025 - February 2026
- Opportunities to connect with each other through a series of discussion groups
- A series of masterclasses with industry professionals
- Mentorship from members of the Regent's Park Open Air Theatre team
- Access to studio space for practical work when available
- The opportunity for an ongoing relationship with Regent's Park Open Air Theatre
- Tickets to Regent's Park Open Air Theatre's 2026 season




### WHO WE'RE LOOKING FOR

### We are looking for five theatre creatives who:

- Have already demonstrated great skill as a theatre-maker and a commitment to their craft
- Are (or have recently been) creating their own work in smaller venues and community spaces, assisting established practitioners or working at an equivalent level to this
- Have been a lead artist (i.e not an associate/assistant) on at least one (but no more than four) professional productions
- Would benefit from having space to develop work outside of their home
- Would benefit from masterclasses, discussion groups and mentoring as they forge the next stage in their career and develop their practice

We welcome applications from directors, playwrights, dramaturgs, designers of all kinds, composers, and any other theatre practitioners who would benefit from this initiative and who clearly meet the above criteria
