

ABOUT US


Established in 1932, the multiaward-winning Regent's Park **Open Air Theatre is one of the** largest theatres in London (at a capacity of 1,304). **Passionate about producing** popular, enriching and unexpected theatre that provides a lens into the here and now, the scale and ambition of our productions together with our magical outdoor setting makes us unique in the capital's cultural landscape. In 2024 we welcomed over 180,000 people to our 27-week summer season.

Over the last fifteen years, our productions have won seven Olivier Awards, ten WhatsOnStage Awards, and four Evening Standard Awards. We were named London Theatre of the Year in 2017 by The Stage, and received the Highly Commended Award for London Theatre of the Year in 2021. Our productions have toured the UK, and have transferred to both the West End and the United States. Our 2016 revival of *Jesus Christ Superstar* has just finished tours of both the UK and North America, and has recently commenced a tour of Australia. Our 2024 revival of *Fiddler on the Roof* will transfer to London's Barbican Theatre this summer, followed by a UK and Ireland tour.

As a registered charity that receives no regular public subsidy, we rely entirely on earned income and charitable contributions. Nevertheless, we introduced 33,000 tickets at £15 across the whole of 2024's summer season and we regularly work with local charities. Each year, on average, we subsidise tickets for 6,000 school pupils.

Food and drink plays a significant role in the Open Air Theatre experience, with our inhouse bars and restaurants including Covered Dining (recently certified as a Sustainably Run Restaurant), The Grill and The Pizza Oven. We also have our own picnic lawn and the West End's longest bar!

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre has become one of the most independently sustainable and financially successful producing theatres in the country, and we're proud to embark on the next stage of our vision with ever increasing artistic ambition and entrepreneurial spirit.

ABOUT THEATRE DANCE LAB

The Theatre Dance Lab is an exciting new artist development programme for early-career musical theatre choreographers. It is a paid residency that will give two choreographers the chance to develop their practice through studio time, coaching, and access to world-class dancers, and to create a brand new piece of work to be showcased at Regent's Park Open Air Theatre.

Regent's Park Open Air Theatre will offer each successful choreographer:

- A £3,000 commissioning fee to develop a new piece of work (15-20mins in length) with a cohort of professional dancers.
- Six hours of coaching with Artistic Director, Drew McOnie
- Three two-hour sessions with industry-leading external theatre choreographers
- Three hours of mentoring from the theatre's producing team and other colleagues.
- Access to 3.5 weeks of free rehearsal space and office resources for both prep and creation.
- Budget to see relevant work at other performance venues, as well as attend symposiums, conferences and networking events.
- Daytime sharing on our main stage, showcasing each choreographer's work to both new and existing audiences alongside selected industry colleagues who will add value to each artist's professional career development.



WHO WE'RE LOOKING FOR

The successful choreographers will likely:

- Be interested in choreographing specifically for musical theatre
- Have choreographed for several colleges and/or drama schools
- Have choreographed no more than three professional regional productions
- Be yet to choreograph a show in a SOLT-registered venue that has run for more than three weeks
- Not be in training at the time of application

We are looking to support two choreographers who we will engage on a freelance basis. Both successful artists will need to have full-time availability from Monday 8th September 2025 up to and including Friday 19th September 2025, and enough availability during the year to allow for up to twenty hours of mentoring/coaching/meetings etc.

HOW TO APPLY

To apply, please send in:

- 1. A copy of your CV (no more than two side of A4).
- 2. A video featuring sixteen bars of choreography (eight counts of eight) set to one of the following pieces of music:
 - 'Breathe' In the Heights
 - 'Dance at the Gym' West Side Story
 - 'Ease on Down the Road' The Wiz
 - 'Living it Up on Top' Hadestown
 - 'Pure Imagination' Charlie and the Chocolate Factory
 - 'The Next Ten Minutes' The Last Five Years

The video should feature one dancer, either the applicant themselves or another dancer performing the applicant's work. The video must be one shot and filmed with a static camera. A phone camera is absolutely fine for this and there is no need to use additional lighting, costume or other effects.

If you feel your video needs additional context, you are welcome to send a short paragraph (no more than 100 words) along with your video, but this is not a requirement.

Should you have any access requirements or need any reasonable adjustments to be made in order to deliver this and/or attend an interview, please e-mail jobs@openairtheatre.com.

Applications should be received by no later than 12pm on Wednesday 16th April 2025. Interviews will take place on the 12th & 13th May 2025.

Feedback will be provided to all interviewed applicants on receipt of a written request no later than 1 week after the date of interview. We regret that due to the volume of applications expected feedback cannot be provided to applicants who aren't invited to interview.
